## Two convenient Ways to Automatically Pay Your City of Muskegon Water and Sewer Bill.

Under the Automatic Pay program your water bill payment is automatically deducted from

- 1.) Your regular bank checking account each month or
- 2.) Charged to your Visa, MasterCard or Discover card each month.

## IT'S EASY TO SIGN UP

- 1. Simply complete the authorization form included below. Please be sure to indicate the service address to be enrolled and the automatic payment plan you wish to enroll in.
- 2. Remember to sign the authorization form. Your signature authorizes the City to automatically pay your water bill and is required for program enrollment. There is no charge and you may discontinue at any time. Your application will be processed within 10 days of receipt.
- 3. While you participate in either the Automatic Bank Debt program or the Automatic Credit Card payment program, we will continue to read your meter and send you a bill as usual. You will receive the bill approximately 10-15 days before it is due to give you a chance to review it. You will not have to do anything with the bill except keep it for your records.
